The mission of Montana CASA/GAL Association is to support, develop, expand and unite local CASA/GAL programs so they can maximize their effectiveness while advocating for Montana's abused and neglected children.

Our Vision is for 100% of eligible Montana youth to be appointed a CASA advocate.

Our strategic plan outlines strategies and goals to support our mission in 4 core areas.

- Support local CASA/GAL programs through training, organizational development and financial support.
- Support adherence to National CASA standards.
- Advocate for state policy and funding to protect and serve abused and neglected children.
- Promote CASA/GAL through a statewide marketing campaign to raise awareness of our work and cultivate volunteers.

MONTANA CASA/GAL IMPACT

Children who have experienced abuse or neglect fare better with a CASA/GAL.

Studies have shown:

- They are more likely to find a safe, permanent home
- They are more likely to succeed in school
- They are half as likely to re-enter the foster care system
- Volunteers are trained to understand the impact of trauma on children

Having a stable relationship with a supportive adult can help children do well, even when they face significant hardships.

Montana currently has 1600+ children waiting for a CASA.

We are leading the continued growth and development of a network of Local Montana CASA programs.

There are currently 15 local programs across the state of Montana.

Each Local CASA Program recruits, trains and supports their CASA Volunteers.




FISCAL REPORT BY CATEGORY AND PERCENTAGE

MONTANA CASA/GAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Goal #1: National CASA Alignment

- Completed the development of MTCASA Infrastructure
- Developed training and support for local programs to meet National CASA/GAL accreditation requirements

Goal #2: Resource Development

- In 2021, procured approximately \$30,000 from individual donors due to MTCASA board engagement
- Establishment of MTCASA Endowment via Montana Community Foundation

Goal #3: Business Services & Training

 Developed and provided trainings to local program staff, advocates and board members via webinar series

Goal #4: Legislative

 Actively participated in Montana Legislative Sessions by providing information to legislators and the governor

Goal #5: Promotions, Networking, and Education

 Established working relationships with state stakeholders such as the Montana Supreme Court Improvement Project, Montana Department of Child and Family Services, Linking Systems of Care, Montana Legislative Interim Committee for Children and Families, and Child Abuse and Neglect Conference

MONTANA CASA/GAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS CONTINUED

Goal #6: Staffing

 Provided and leased a MTCASA vehicle for director to travel to local programs and meetings

Goal #7: Board Development

- Adopted a policy (created and led by board chair) regarding annual board giving
- Recruited and onboarded three new board members

Goal #8: Local Program Growth and Expansion

- Held discussions with local programs regarding their interest and capacity to expand into areas where CASA does not currently exist
- Supported local programs in volunteer recruitment. By increasing the number of advocates we are able to increase the number of children served.



CHAIRPERSON'S STATEMENT

The MTCASA/GAL Board of Directors is made up of twelve diverse members from communities across the state. Throughout 2021, the Board and the Executive Director in collaboration with the fifteen local programs in Montana, worked towards achieving our vision that every child in Montana who is eligible for a CASA will have one.

Serving on this Board has afforded me a deeper understanding of the needs of children in Montana. Children removed from their homes and placed in foster care are among the most vulnerable. This is when a CASA can make a transformative difference in a child's life. When a child is appointed a CASA, they gain a trained, caring volunteer whose only purpose is to advocate for the child's best interests. This can lessen the trauma of being moved from everything that is familiar. The CASA forges a positive and stable relationship with the child and stays with the child until resolution of the case. By being involved in every aspect of the child's life, the CASA can give the court information to aid in judicial decisions.

The MTCASA/GAL Association is helping the existing local CASA programs in the state to develop the capacity to serve 100% of eligible children in their communities. We are also committed to supporting the establishment of CASA programs in communities that do not have one. We are grateful to those who have joined us in this effort. Together we are making a difference in children's lives, one child at a time. We look forward in 2022 to new and continuing partnerships to benefit our most precious resource, our children.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE ROAD

The purpose of the in-person site visits were to help ensure each local program was receiving the support they need to provide the very best services to every child in their region in need of a CASA. These listening sessions included time spent with program directors and staff, board chairs and judges.

April was also given the opportunity to provide guidance to programs regarding compliance with National CASA/GAL Standards for Local Programs and non profit best practices.

The result of these visits provided vital information to MTCASA to plan and implement individual program and statewide program trainings on a variety of topics in 2022.
