#### **Montana CASA Conference**

The Montana CASA Conference will be hosted in Helena this September. This conference provides training and networking for our 15 local programs across Montana. We're finalizing our great agenda with presenters like Mississippi County Court Judge Favre and a lived experience panel which will include a parent whose child was reunified with them, with the support of a CASA!

#### **More Expansion & Growth**

TANF funds helped CASA programs across the state serve more children this state fiscal year. Projects funded by TANF include volunteer recruitment, CASA awareness campaigns, and expansion of programs. Our second year of TANF funds begins July 1 and we can't wait to see the continued expansion & growth throughout the CASA network.



With the help of TANF funds, CASA of Lake & Sanders opened a new Connections Room in Sanders County where they can provide supervised family visits and CASAs have access to a safe space to meet with children or parents. Soon a private room for parenting classes will be available.

## CASA Success Story from CASA of Missoula

When CASA Susan Monahan was appointed to her case, all four of the children in the family were living in an RV with their parents. Both parents were addicted to methamphetamine, and the mother was violent toward the father. The family was in so much upheaval that none of the children were in school.

In Mineral county, the court met infrequently and informally. Susan saw this and immediately formed a close team with the foster placements and the CPS on the case.



Together, they helped the four children recover from the trauma of their early childhoods in safe placements. All of the girls were old enough to understand what was happening and Susan honored their curiosity and made sure her work with the court was transparent.

When Susan heard the twins wanted to move back in with their dad, who was

in treatment, she realized it was her role to help the family court case stay at the pace of his recovery. Across two foster placements in two different counties during four years, Susan would check in with the twins each month and make sure they were paying as much attention to school as they were to their court dates. This summer, the twins moved in with their baby half sister and their father. They say they've never been happier: they have a new extended family and a sense of belonging they say they never had in their foster homes.

# Eastern MT CASA/GAL Expands into Fort Peck Reservation





A year ago, Eastern MT CASA/GAL learned that Tribal children on the Fort Peck Reservation were not represented by an attorney. This was when Executive Director, Cherie LeBlanc-Dyba, started a conversation with the Tribal Courts about having CASA advocate for children in foster care. In March, Eastern Montana CASA/GAL began working with the Assiniboine Sioux Tribal Nation on the Fort Peck Reservation to provide support for American Indian children in the foster care system.

"CASA volunteers come from all walks of life, and we are looking for people within the Fort Peck area/Reservation to become volunteers. Kids need to have people from their community so they feel comfortable and supported," said LeBlanc-Dyba. "We will provide the training and support volunteers need to be the best advocates possible for the kids you serve...we are here to learn and be a part of the network of people supporting children."
